The Smith Chapel Food Pantry began in the Smith Chapel United Methodist Church basement. The effort began by trying to help church members and neighbors who were in need.

When the basement and two small closets had no more empty space, the church moved the pantry to its current location at 1333 E. Front St. in Logan. Volunteers staff the pantry, and 100% of the all donations go to

helping those in need.

Appreciative and grateful best describe the staff when a donation, great or small, is delivered. At this time, it is estimated that the pantry serves 800 families a month. There is also a thrift store on the premises, which is open to all on Wednesdays and Fridays from 9 a. to 4 p.
